Notes on the form "Assessment Components"

Welcome to the BayNAT Graduate School!

We would like to give you some important information about providing and documenting credits at this graduate school.

The list of Assessment Components provided to you is an important document and it is your responsibility for updating and safekeeping it. In addition to your name, the header contains the name of the doctoral programme and the names of your mentors. Please check the entries made and inform us immediately of any discrepancies.

The list of Assessment Components plays an important role in your doctorate at BayNAT. Every course that you attend as part of your doctoral programme and for which you wish to receive credits must be documented in this list. The list of possible Assessment Components which can be cited is regulated in the descriptions of the doctoral programmes, which can be found in the annex to the BayNAT regulations. This is subject to the regulations of your doctoral programme.

If you have participated in an activity that is to be recognised, please enter the title of the Assessment Component (e.g. "Participation in research seminar") in a field of the left column and the number of credits awarded, according to the regulations in the doctoral programme (e.g. "2"), in the corresponding field of the middle column. Then have the lecturer who supervised the Assessment Component confirm the awarded credits in the corresponding field in the right-hand column. Credits that cannot be confirmed by a lecturer (e.g. lectures at conferences, publications, etc.) must be confirmed by the chair of your mentoring committee.

A complete list of at least 30 verified credits resulting from your doctoral programme is a prerequisite for admission to the doctoral examination procedure. Accordingly, this list must be submitted when applying for admission to the doctoral examination procedure in accordance with §9 of the BayNAT doctoral regulations. It is hence important to keep the list carefully and conscientiously.
